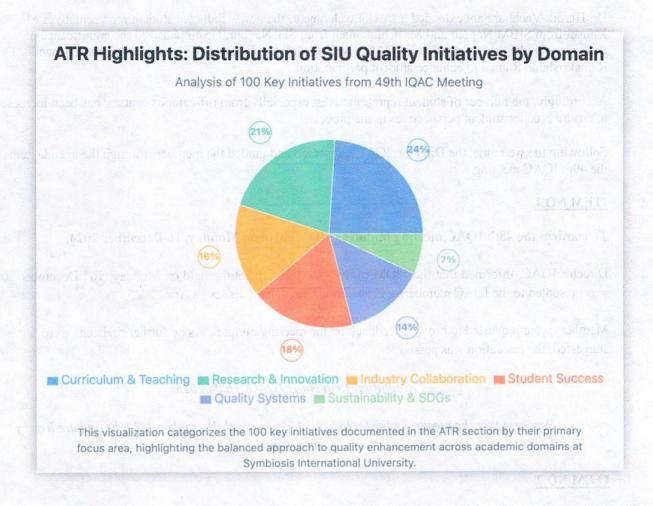

As the members wanted to know about the SAF-Symbiosis Accreditation Framework, Dr. Hardik Vachharajani explained that the SAF pilot will commence in July 2025, with the selected institutes receiving a different communication data template for the AQR cycle. This will test whether the new framework is inclusive enough to collect data for all rankings from a single submission. The pilot phase will continue through December 2025, after which the data will be analysed to improve the framework before full rollout across SIU in the following academic year.

ITEM NO.3

To update members about the A.Y. 2023-24 Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) submission to NAAC.

Director, IQAC, provided an update on the AQAR submission process. He mentioned that, unlike in previous years, where NAAC allowed multiple deadline extensions, the latest notification suggested that no such extensions would be granted for the current cycle. In anticipation of this, the QMB team adopted a proactive approach by initiating the collection and consolidation of data from all constituent institutes, departments, and research centers. Consequently, the AQAR for the academic year 2023–24 was submitted on Thursday, 16 January 2025, and was approved by NAAC on the same day.

For the academic year 2024-25, the QMB team will begin data collection from 1 July 2025 to ensure adequate time for all units to provide complete and accurate data.

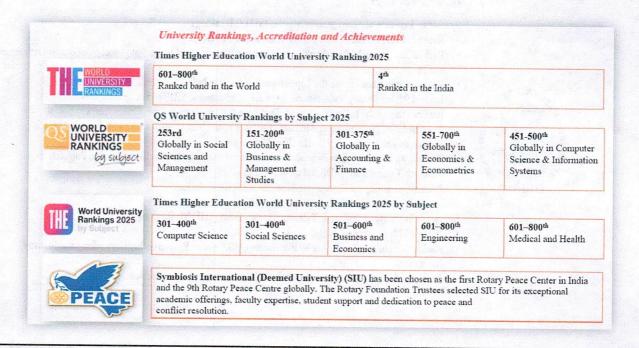

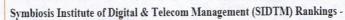

Dr. Dharmendra Pandey emphasized that while SIU demonstrates strong performance in overall university rankings, there is significant scope for improvement in areas related to sustainability reporting. He clarified that the challenge lies not in the absence of impactful sustainability initiatives but in the limited documentation and effective communication of these efforts. To bridge this gap, QMB is in the process of developing a comprehensive framework to systematically capture and report Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) related activities, ensuring greater consistency and visibility across all institutional domains.

Dr. Hardik Vachharajani reinforced the importance of embedding SDGs within the academic ecosystem. He stated that efforts are underway to map existing courses to relevant SDGs, aiming to strengthen the University's commitment to sustainability through curriculum integration. To support this initiative, it was proposed that the STARS Framework, a model used by several global institutions, be circulated among all constituent units as a guiding reference.

Resolution Item No.4: IQAC: 16.04.2025

Resolved that the members noted and appreciated SIU's performance in various national and international rankings and accreditations.

Dr. Dharmendra Pandey informed the members that a detailed communication regarding the STARS Framework will be sent to all concerned stakeholders to enhance understanding of SDG mapping practices.

Dr. Hardik Vachharajani proposed that the topic of SDG mapping and integration be included as a session in the upcoming Prakarsh QMB Knowledge Series to build institutional capacity and share best practices across the University. He also mentioned that, if necessary, assistance from the Director of Academics could be sought to enhance understanding and ensure the effective implementation of aligning courses with the SDGs, thereby supporting their integration into the curriculum.

To update about the initiatives of the Quality Management and Benchmarking (QMB) department.

- SAF-Symbiosis Accreditation Framework
- Prakarsh- QMB Knowledge Series

Dr. Hardik Vachharajani, presented recent developments and initiatives of the QMB department:

1. Symbiosis Accreditation Framework (SAF):

Following the receipt of the copyright for the Symbiosis Accreditation Framework (SAF), the SAF data templates have been developed and mapped. Internal testing is currently underway. Four institutions, SIT Pune, SIBM Nagpur, SIIB Pune, and SLS Noida, have been selected for the pilot testing phase. Post-testing, QMB will initiate awareness programs and the broader pilot implementation of SAF.

2. Prakarsh - QMB Knowledge Series:

The 7th session of the *Prakarsh* Knowledge Series was conducted on February 28, 2025, focusing on "Integrating Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) into Higher Education: Challenges and Opportunities." The session was delivered by Ms. Gayatri Mendanha, Assistant Professor at Symbiosis School for Liberal Arts, and was attended by over 95 participants. Practical examples and insights were shared to encourage the integration of IKS into mainstream academia. A certificate of participation in *Prakarsh* through the QMBLMS platform was also enabled.

Director, IQAC, presented insights on the current status of the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) Phase II process scheduled for SIDTM, SIIB, SIMC, and SIMS between December 2024 and July 2025. The Director informed that formal communication had been shared with the concerned institutes, outlining the key preparatory steps, including the formation of NBA committees, training of staff, preparation of the Self-Assessment Report (SAR), internal reviews, and mock audits.

It was noted that Senior Directors have been appointed as mentors to support the institutes and guide them through the accreditation process, ensuring compliance with NBA requirements and timelines. As part of capacity-building efforts, two significant programs were conducted:

- An NBA Orientation Session on 12 February 2025
- An NBA Workshop, conducted in collaboration with STLRC, on 26 February 2025

Mr. Harshad Gune, Head of Software Development, presented an overview of the department's key highlights and initiatives.

1. Team Overview:

Introduced the Software Development team, comprising members with roles ranging from senior to junior software developers.

- 2. Core Services:
 - Customization and support for Moodle LMS (46 instances).
 - Development and maintenance of Drupal-based web applications for administrative and departmental use.
 - Maintenance of 8 institutional websites.
- 3. Development Initiatives:
 - o Implemented features like attendance reports, feedback systems, parental access, OBE assessment tools, and SSO integration with MDC.
 - o Supported platforms for webinars, online exams, course offerings, and health promotions.
- 4. Academic and Administrative Tools:
 - o Developed portals and tools for AQAR, academic calendars, competitions, CO-PO attainment, and data for institutional rankings (NIRF, AISHE).
- 5. Website Maintenance for Centers:
 - Ongoing support for multiple Symbiosis research and academic centers, including SCMIA, SCUS, SCNN, SSS, SCSCR, SCY, SCWRM, and SCAAI.
- 6. Ongoing & Planned Projects:
 - Migration of Moodle from v4.0.6 to 4.5.3.
 - Migration of Drupal from v8.9.16 to 10.4.3.
 - o New developments like the Admin Audit portal and NBA-compliant OBE enhancements.

Mr. Harshad Gune highlighted the challenge of staff retention within the software development team. In response, Honourable Vice Chancellor Dr. Ramakrishnan Raman recommended adopting sustainable staffing models by identifying and nurturing internal employees who have demonstrated loyalty and a willingness to upskill, rather than depending solely on external recruitment.

Ms. Shalini Singh, Head of Software Development, presented an overview of the department's key highlights and initiatives

1. Moodle Maintenance & Support:

- o Introduced a structured, multi-tiered support system to streamline Moodle-related issue resolution.
- o A dedicated team of six Moodle IT Support Engineers was onboarded, each assigned to a specific institute.
- Support levels range from self-service to expert intervention and final escalation to the Vice Chancellor.

2. Process and People Management:

- o Emphasis on a data-driven approach to monitor and improve support efficiency.
- Standardization of processes, best practice sharing, and structured training programs implemented.
- o Improved stakeholder communication with defined roles and contacts points.

3. People Metrics & Engagement:

- Focus on managing absenteeism and attrition with regular manager-employee interactions and feedback loops.
- o Measures introduced to ensure adherence to leave policies and improve team stability.

4. Process Improvements:

- o Implementation of an internal software requisition policy.
- Resource optimization, including release of part-time support personnel based on workload analysis.
- Development of a customized Moodle mobile app aligned with desktop features.

Presentation on innovative practices and quality initiatives adopted at SIU by Symbiosis Institute of Health Sciences (SIHS), Pune.

Dr. Sammita Jadhav, Director, SIHS presented on the quality initiatives at SIHS.

• Future-Ready Curriculum

SIHS has aligned its programs (Hospital & Healthcare Management, Public Health, Behavioural Health Sciences, Reproductive Technology and Paramedical Technology) with rapid industry changes, embedding simulation-based learning—using high-fidelity manikins, virtual labs and inter-professional exercises—across both undergraduate and postgraduate offerings.

Industry-Academia Collaboration

A recent CXO Meet with healthcare leaders shaped curriculum updates and led to the launch of six new programs, including Post-Graduate Diplomas in Digital Health, Healthcare Informatics & Data Analytics, Rehabilitation Science, and multiple Paramedical Technology specializations.

Skill Development & Competency

Simulation training has demonstrably improved students' clinical preparedness, decision-making, teamwork and communication skills, as confirmed by alumni and recruiter feedback.

• Faculty and Student Training in Emerging Technologies

SIHS has acquired tools such as SMARTPLS and NVivo, alongside Turnitin, Grammarly and SPSS. Faculty development covers AI, data analytics and simulation pedagogy, with extensions into student workshops and certification programs.

• Comprehensive Student Lifecycle Management

From induction through internships, mentoring, and alumni engagement, every touchpoint incorporates industry projects, soft-skills training, field visits, and service-learning, supported by regular audits, peer reviews, and outcome-based education models.

• Conferences and Research Engagement

SIHS continues to host and participate in national forums—SYMHEALTH, SYMSIM, and SYMRESEARCH—fostering a community-hospital interface and promoting research, innovation, and best practices in healthcare education.

Dr. Sammita Jadhav highlighted that SIHS students made a significant impact during the COVID-19 pandemic by managing a 400-bed facility and coordinating vaccination campaigns with zero fatalities.

SIHS has been recognized in the 2025 edition of the "India's Best B-School".

In response, Honourable Vice Chancellor Dr. Ramakrishnan Raman said that the idea of an independent accreditation agency would be taken to the Board for discussion, and shared that SIU is already working on recruiting researchers through the Young Investigators Meet in Agra, with interviews in progress and new researchers expected to join in the next 6–8 months.
